PIE FOR DINNER!?

New Park Blvd. Shop to Offer Sweet and Savory Pies *By Andrea Bacal*

University Heights is again looking forward to a new restaurant experience. Pop Pies is opening on Park Blvd. at Meade Ave. in early July! Those of us who were lucky enough to taste their samples at the May meeting or at one of their pop-up events have a personal reason for being excited. For the rest, I will try to describe why.

We attended a recent pop-up event at a Mission Hills coffee shop, where free pies were available for all from 5 pm – 8 pm. By 5 pm, there was already quite a crowd and line out the door. But let me back up a bit.

Steve Torres and Gan Suebsarakham go way back. Steve describes their beginnings like this: “Our journey with Pop Pie Co. started soon after Gan completed his MBA program and wanted to pursue his dream of opening a restaurant where he could share his passion for baking and cooking,” Steve said.

Gan never intended to get master's degree in business, but it happened after his visa was declined because an officer deemed his culinary and baking school background not enough to renew his visa. He was told to come back when he found a new academic goal. He came back all right! Earned an MBA and is now ready to share his passion and love for baking and cooking with everyone.

Steve said he lived in Seattle for 10 years where he was embedded in the coffee culture; this has made coffee the perfect partner to Gan's pies. “Our menu will consist of a handful of five-inch savory



pies and another handful of our three-inch sweet pies with exact numbers to be determined,” Steve said. “We will pair our savory pies with a choice of either three cold sides or three hot sides and offer the two as a lunch or dinner combination meal. A savory pie and a side for your meal and a smaller sweet pie for dessert!”

We tasted many of the choices. My favorite of the savory pies was a chicken in a delicious sauce whose flavors are globally inspired. The absolute best part of this savory pie was its crust. I always thought my mother made the most tender, best-tasting, flakiest pie crusts. But Gan's pie crust is beyond flaky, buttery, and delicious!

Of the sweet pies we tasted, my favorite was the lemon. Light and fluffy, somewhere between a lemon meringue

pie and a lemon cream pie, it seems to float into your mouth and magically deliver its heavenly taste.

“We are a fast-casual restaurant by definition,” Steve said. “Customers will walk up to a counter, make their selections and receive their food within a few minutes. Our concept will include a multi-roaster specialty coffee program, six craft beers on tap, and wine. Our goal is to create a unique eating and drinking experience and provide excellent service to our customers.”

Pop Pies will be an exciting addition to our neighborhood!

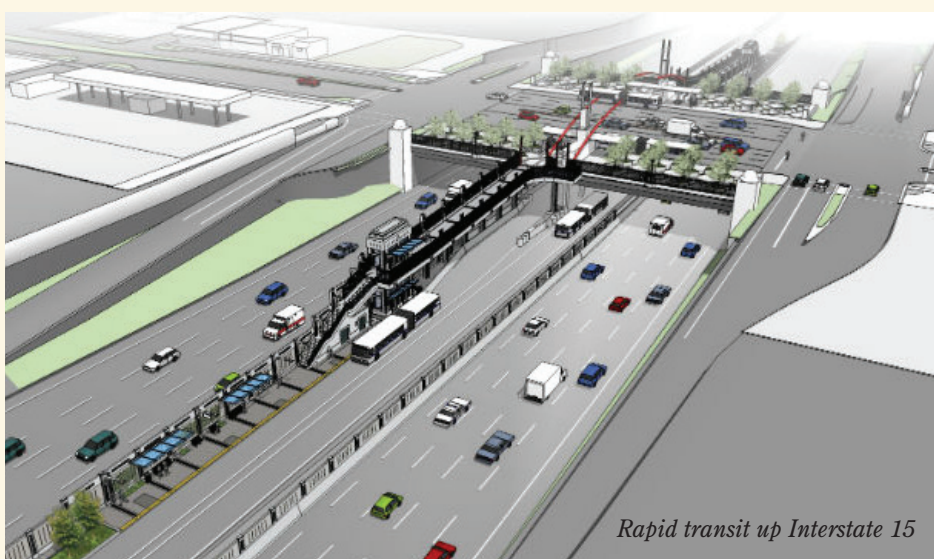

In Case You Missed It SANDAG'S BIG PLANS

Rapid Transit, HOV Lanes, Three New Trolleys, and Much More Planned

The San Diego Association of Governments, better known by its acronym SANDAG, presented some big plans for improving transportation in the City and County of San Diego, including University Heights (UH), at the June University Heights Community Association (UHCA) meeting. SANDAG is the regional authority for San Diego County among whose more recent

transport projects is the new Park Blvd. rapid bus lane.

Before the SANDAG talk, however, the June meeting opened with the usual Crime Watch report from David Surwillo, the community relations officer for the Western Division of the San Diego Police Department (SDPD). Officer Surwillo (Continued on Page 3)

UHCA is again sponsoring "Cookies with the Cops" (Thanks once again for organizing this, Nan McGraw!) on Thursday, August 25. More details in this paper. This will give you an opportunity to meet informally with the police who work our neighborhood to discuss face-to-face any concerns you have.

Otherwise, there's a ton of things to do within a stone's throw of our neck of the woods – beaches and snow cones beckon! Whatever you do this summer, I hope you have a great one!

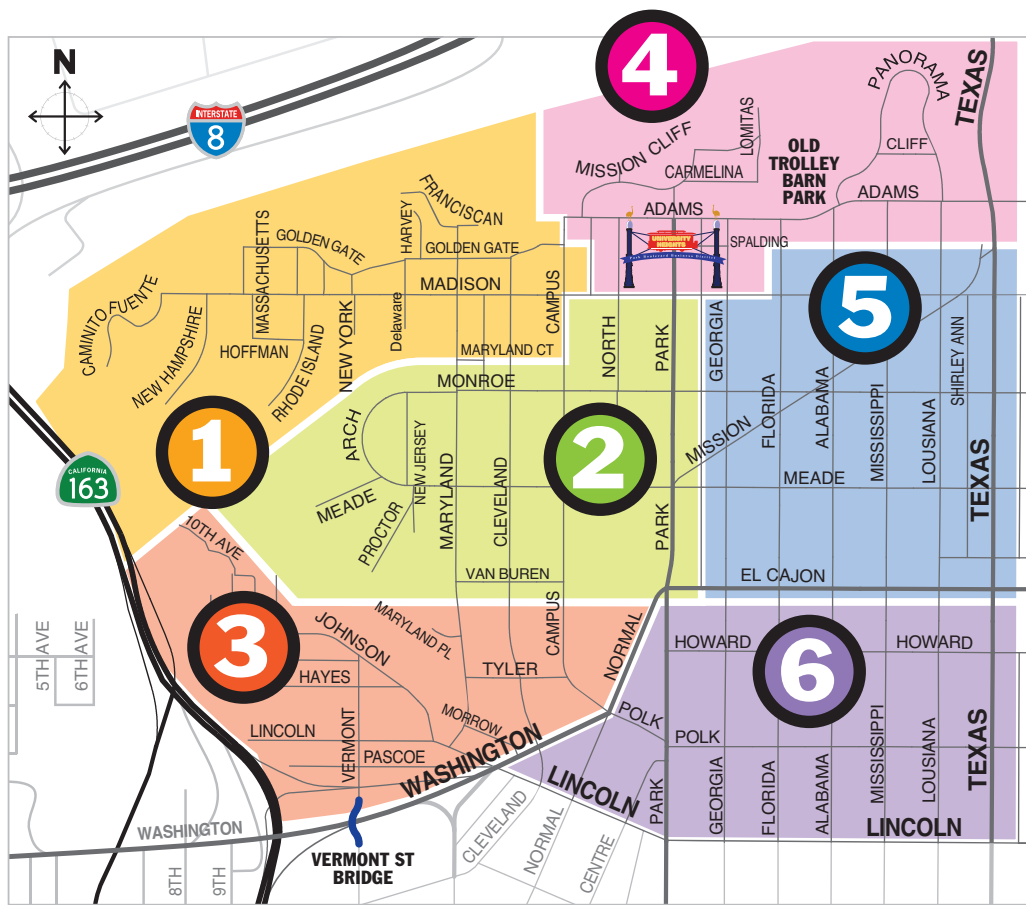

Cookies with the Cops coming to a location near you!

When the University Heights Community Association (UHCA) started “Coffee with the Cops” in the mid-1980s, the crime statistics in University Heights (UH) were high. Residents together with the San Diego Police Department (SDPD), went from neighbor to neighbor to listen and note their concerns. Together, the SDPD and the UHCA closed down some serious drug houses, and, as a result, crime stats plummeted.

We stressed neighbors getting together to form Neighborhood Watch groups. Later, we saw the need to link Neighborhood Watch groups into Zone Watches, which became an email outreach joining blocks and residents together. This unique system, managed by UHCA’s Zone Coordinators, communicates crime stats and other information within their respective zones and throughout the community. Today, Next Door and other social media further enhance communication. Recent evidence of the success of these efforts has been the dialogue regarding problems and solutions at The Point.

However, it takes more than UHCA providing events and meetings to make safe and desirable mini-neighborhoods. It takes you to determine the cohesiveness of your block and outreach to your neighbors. This summer consider getting together with your neighbors to throw a block party or organize a lawn movie night. These are simple ways to bring neighbors together and help spot potential crime.

We also urge you to join UHCA and SDPD for this summer’s “Cookies with the Cops” on Thursday, August 25, at one of three locations listed below. Though we’ll have cookies, why not bring a batch of your favorite cookies to share with your neighbors? At these sites, UHCA will have a prototype of new Neighborhood/Zone Watch signs. Be sure to ask us about ways you can sponsor a sign near your home. You can make a difference.

provided a community crime update and also offering advice on dealing with stolen property, including taking photos of items within your home as well as their series number so that police reports can include that information. In addition, UHCA presented a new Neighborhood Watch sign design for comment.

In another important announcement, Adriana Martinez from Councilmember Todd Gloria’s office, informed attendees that the exterior of the UH branch library on Park Blvd. will be painted prior to its 50-year anniversary celebration this coming October 29, and that city’s maintenance department has been confirmed this will happen in that timeframe. Meanwhile, Mark Zambon, from the office of U.S. Representative Susan Davis, described a new water bill that the congresswoman has sponsored that, if passed, will allow the use of reclamation monies for additional refunds and tax credits to consumers who install drought-tolerant options, including gray water systems, rain barrels and other systems.

Additionally Bill Ellig, a longtime UH resident who is a member of Uptown Planners, discussed some recommendations the group will be making to amend certain aspects of the Uptown Community Plan update.



SANDAG’s “Forward” Vision

The speaker of the night was Chris Kluth, a senior regional planner for SANDAG, presented the “San Diego Forward,” a regional plan that includes transportation projects the organization is undertaking through 2050. Though the plan looks out to mid-century, Chris said it is actually updated every four years so that it can help guide transportation updates in line with future growth areas for jobs and housing. For instance, while the former regional plan had growth all over San Diego County, the current plan concentrates growth in the western one-third of the county in order to preserve open space and wildlife habitat in other locations.

Looking forward, SANDAG projects San Diego will grow by about one million people over the next 30 years. To accommodate the increased population, SANDAG’s new transportation projects infrastructure will include:

- Rapid transit up Interstate 15 (I-15);
- High Occupancy Vehicle (HOV) lanes on Interstate 5 (I-5) from North County to the Mexico border;
- Operational improvements to 66 miles of existing highway;
- Eighty-eight new miles of standard highway lanes;
- Five new trolley lines;
- New Sprinter Express service in North County;
- Four new streetcar lines;
- Two intermodal transit centers;
- Start of an eventual 275-mile regional bikeway;
- Traffic calming improvements;
- And 77 highway interchange improvements.

Chris also emphasized the City of San Diego needs to take advantage of car- and bike-sharing programs and improve safety and access for pedestrians and bikers in its neighborhoods. Design projects are in the works that will address the concerns of people who are interested in bike riding but are concerned about safety - the top concern of two-thirds of interested in bike riding in San Diego County. These include bikeways separated from streets, connect to regional transit and ideal for short trips, such as riding to the library or grocery store.

As always, Chris cited funding as the biggest challenge to completing these or any infrastructure project. For more information on current projects that have received funding, please visit <http://www.sdfoward.com/>.

April Brandenstein has a new business in UH. The old silk mill building is now home to Meraki (pronounced “meh-RAH-kee”), her new cafe. It is one week into a “soft opening,” as the temporary sign says. So what are we to expect?

At this time, you may buy Equator organic fair trade coffee (which will be freshly ground). This is the only place in all of San Diego where it is sold. There is also organic loose leaf tea. Yes, you can get these things at a variety of places BUT, at Meraki Cafe, April blends her own syrups and horchata mix. No bottles of premixed add-ons here. Baked goods are from Bread & Cie and bagels from BCB are made fresh daily. There are also acai bowls and granola.

April graduated from the Art Institute of New York City in 2003 and has a degree in Culinary Arts and Restaurant Management. Some ideas for the near future for her location are a book exchange, space for local artists’ work, yoga on the patio, and definitely an herb garden in the back patio where you may have your well-behaved dog with you. She is also considering movies on the patio and hopes to have everything from weddings to charity events there, as well.



Asked why she believes her Cafe will make it at this location when others have not, April said, it is “to do something with passion, creativity and love; to put something of yourself into her work,” which will prevail. And, that is the meaning of the Greek word, Meraki.

Editor’s Note: For those readers who may not know the history of this historic building, the Silk Mill was a thriving cottage industry at the turn of the last century. It was across the street from the Ostrich Farm. The San Diego Chamber of Commerce helped establish it, encouraging homeowners to raise silkworms in their backyards. Tourists would also drop by to watch mill operations or buy silk products. In 1929, the business relocated to 4665 Park Blvd where it operated for another two years before closing.



Also, there is never, ever, any glass allowed in the park – too many bare kids' feet to worry about. Citywide park restrictions also apply to alcoholic beverages and smoking. Please keep your dogs on a short leash so they don't snack on other people or their food. We try to have plenty of trash containers around so that you can help us in keeping the park tidy.

We will surely love her until the end.

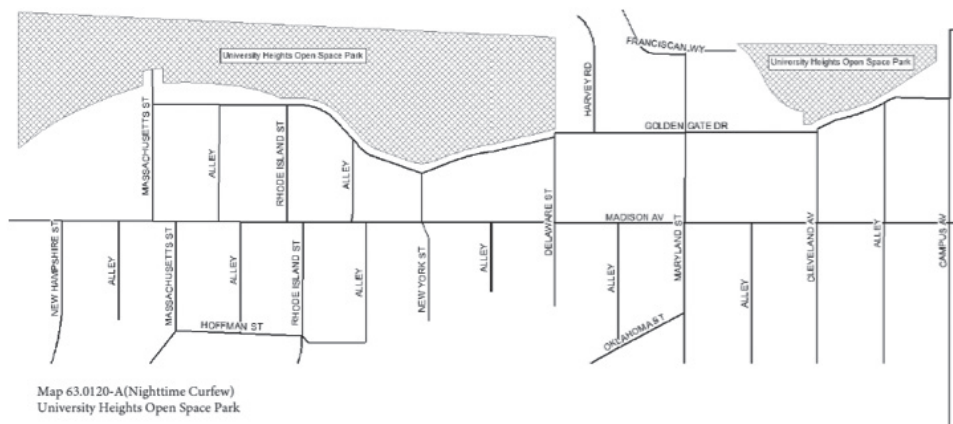

BAN AND CURFEW FOR THE POINT MOVES FORWARD

The San Diego City Council's Public Safety & Livable Neighborhoods Committee voted on May 18 to send the proposal for an alcohol ban and curfew for The Point in University Heights (UH) to the full City Council for adoption. This proposal was presented by the Parks and Recreation Department along with similar proposals concerning other San Diego neighborhood parks. The first reading to the council at large was in June, with final adoption expected to take place in July or August.

Earlier this year, the UH Recreation Council, along with other community groups, recommended that a 24-hour alcohol ban and curfew be established for The Point open space area depicted below in response to resident complaints of frequent alcohol and drug use. The curfew is slated to run from 10 pm to 6 am on April 1 - October 30 and 8 pm to 6 am on November 1 - March 31. The unimproved right-of-way along Golden Gate Drive between New York Street and Rhode Island Street is not part of the curfew area.

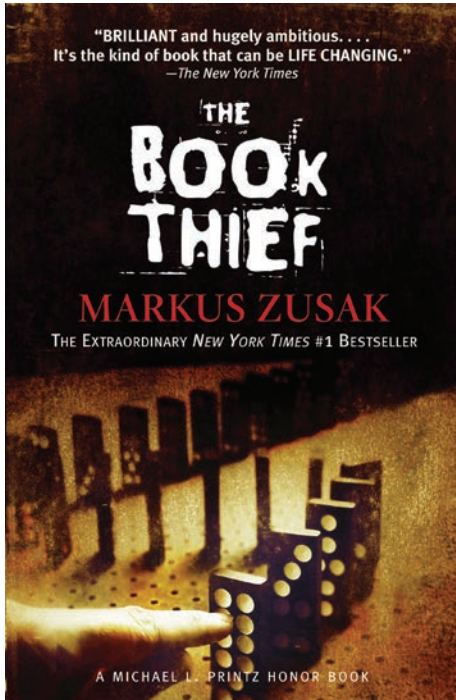

The July Book Club & Salon: The Book Thief By Markus Zusak



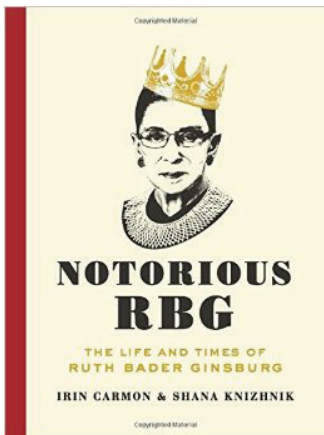
From start to finish, Marcus Zusak tells a captivating story set in 1939 in Nazi Germany. The novel centers on young Liesel Meminger, a girl recently orphaned by the tragic loss of her family. After moving in with a new foster family, Liesel's foster father teaches her to read a book she had stolen from her brother's graveside. And so, when that book is finished, Liesel begins an infatuation with books that leads her on adventures, such as stealing books from book-burnings and houses. Liesel thereby earns her nickname "the book thief," and her relationship with books and reading is what moves the story forward.

Everything changes when Liesel's foster father has to hide a Jew in their basement because of something that happened years before. However, the novel gives a different perspective because it is not shown through the eyes of a Jew but merely a young girl confused by the nature of the times.

In this book Zusak has chosen none other than "Death" to narrate the story. The reader will enjoy the author's writing as "Death" and appreciate how he interprets the character with dark humor and words of wisdom, interspersing Liesel's story with asides about his endless journeys collecting souls of the dead.

Notorious RBG The Life and Times of Ruth Bader Ginsburg By Irin Carmon & Shana Knizhnik

This is the year to celebrate the remarkable accomplishments of U.S. Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg. When co-author Shana Knizhnik was in law school in summer 2013, she and several classmates decided to create a Tumblr blog dedicated to one of their inspirations: Ruth Bader Ginsburg. The "Notorious R.B.G.," featuring memories of Justice Ginsburg as well as her words of wisdom, went viral. Two years later, Knizhnik teamed up with journalist Irin Carmon to write Notorious RBG, a book inspired by the blog. The duo researched and reported the book together, interviewing Justice Ginsburg, her family members, friends, and colleagues.

The authors bring a fresh, appropriately irreverent perspective to scholarship about the justice. In fact, this book is not at all scholarly - and this is a major asset. Taking its chapter headings from the lyrics of late rapper Notorious B.I.G., it provides a stripped down biographical narrative with excerpts from a selection of Justice Ginsburg's seminal opinions, while inserting cartoons, photos, poetry, and even opera lyrics. The brief excerpts from her court opinions are annotated in plain language by prominent academics. Be prepared to enjoy this humorous, accessible, and humanizing profile of an influential woman.

To help homeowners prepare, Cal Fire has created an online guide called "Hardening Your Home," with tips on how to better fire-proof everything at home, from roofs and eaves to decks and garages.

The tips, which can be found at ReadyforWildfire.org, include:

- Replacing wood or shingle roofs with components made of metal or tile.
- Ensuring that eaves and decks are made of or protected by materials that are ignition resistant or non-combustible.
- Keeping a fire extinguisher and tools to fight a blaze, such as shovels, rakes, and hoes, in the garage.

Sure, summer is the time to watch out for dangers like fires or riptides, but mostly it's about enjoying longer days and even warmer nights. I'll see you soon when one of my favorite local performers, Sue Palmer & Her Motel Swing Orchestra, opens up the concert season at the Trolley Barn Park! Until then, have a great and safe summer.

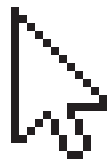

Reporting Graffiti in the City of San Diego

If you see graffiti vandalism in progress, call 911 and report it immediately to the San Diego Police Department (SDPD). Do not confront the vandals yourself. Although they may appear to be harmless, they may be carrying weapons. The police will respond based on the priority of the crime compared to others for which they have calls at the time.

If you see graffiti in your neighborhood on public or private property, report it immediately to the Graffiti Control Program through online reporting at <http://apps.sandiego.gov/streetdiv/> or by calling the Graffiti Hotline at (619) 527-7500.

You may also email photos of the graffiti with location information to Detective Cassie Ericson at CEricson@pd.sandiego.gov,

Calls to Street Division Customer Service are confidential. City crews remove graffiti from City property, usually within five days of receiving a report. City code compliance officers must notify private property owners of graffiti on their property and of their responsibility to remove it. Depending on the cooperation of property owners, it could take longer for graffiti to be removed from private properties.

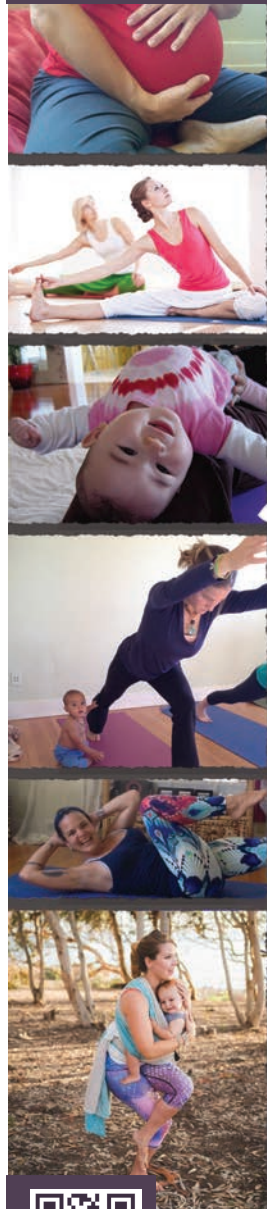
If the graffiti is located on public property, report it immediately to the Graffiti Control Program. If it is a commercial property, report it to the business. If it's on private property, notify the resident. And if it's on your property, remove it immediately.

We also have a rewards program. With our Spray and Pay Graffiti Rewards Program, you could receive up to \$500 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of graffiti vandals.

Try to remove the graffiti with a solvent and rag, such as Goof Off Graffiti Remover. Wear gloves to protect your hands. If you need to paint it out, try to match the existing color. Use a razor blade scraper for removing stickers on glass, signs and benches

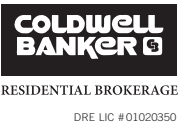

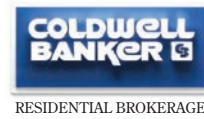
